Health Care News

New Children's Health Program: On January 1, 2006, Washington State's new program for immigrant kids takes effect. The program is limited to 4,300 children, so families need to apply by December 15 to have the best chance of being selected. [Read more](#)

New Medicare Prescription Drug Benefits: On January 1, 2006, Part D begins. Many Medicare enrollees who also receive Medicaid prescription drug coverage will change from Medicare to Medicaid. Assigned plans carry your drugs and pharmacy. Otherwise, you can apply for SHIBA for assistance at 1-800-562-6900.

Federal Budget Changes to Medicaid: The Medicaid program is facing a budget crisis. The House passed a bill that would allow states to charge Medicaid providers. The bill would also allow reductions in services. \$30 billion in cuts in the bill, by contrast, would save money by cutting prescription drug
